WELCOME

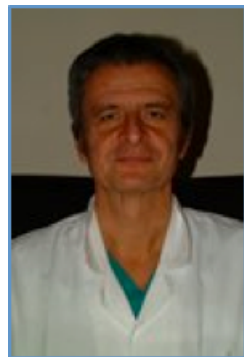

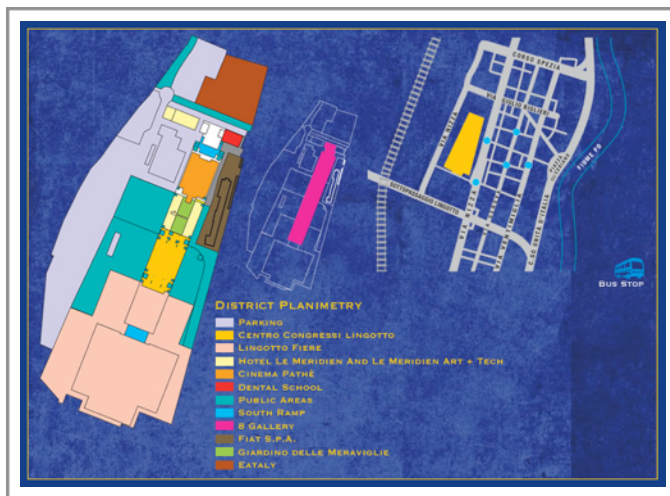
